She provides inpatient and outpatient care across a variety of settings in Madison, Wisconsin and teaches fellows, residents and medical students on a daily basis. She attended medical school at the University of Chicago Pritzker School of Medicine and completed residency in Family Medicine at UCSF in San Francisco. She is board certified in Family Medicine and Addiction Medicine. Prior to moving to Madison, she was a primary care provider in San Francisco working for the Department of Public Health for 9 years where she provided HIV care to individuals living with HIV and substance use treatment within the primary care setting to her patients.
