Description

This presentation will provide an up-to-date view on the population referred to as triply diagnosed with substance use, other mental illnesses and HIV infection.

- Recognize the underlying reasons why and the extent to which substance use disorders are co-morbid with other mental illnesses and with HIV infection.
- Apply syndemic prevention and treatment approaches to people who have been triply diagnosed.
