## Description

This session will describe ways to integrate HIV care/prevention, substance use treatment, and pregnancy care. This session will describe a program in San Francisco that aims to integrate these often-siloed components of care.

## Learning Objectives

- Describe opportunities to integrate HIV care/prevention, substance use disorders (SUD) treatment, and pregnancy care.
- Describe harm reduction strategies that can be integrated into care of pregnant people affected by SUD and HIV.
- Describe frequent barriers to care, and opportunities to reduce those barriers, for pregnant people affected by SUD, HIV/HIV vulnerability.
