## *Xylazine: What the HIV care team needs to know*

### Description

The training will review the growing effect of xylazine contamination of the drug supply for people who use drugs. Epidemiological and geographic trends in xylazine exposure and consumption will be reviewed. Signs, symptoms, and effects of xylazine exposure will be reviewed and provide helpful insights for HIV care teams in how to identify people who are affected by xylazine and how to adjust services to meet the needs of people using drugs and living with HIV.

### Learning Objectives

- Recognize the growing concern regarding xylazine contamination of the drug supply.
- Identify the impact of xylazine on overdose risk and strategies for sedation management.
- Name risk factors for the development of xylazine-associated wounds and strategies for wound management.
- List at least 2 impacts xylazine-contamination has on HIV care teams ability to care for people who use drugs.
