### Description

In this session, the speakers will discuss trends in adolescent and young adult (AYA) HIV acquisition, intersections with adolescent substance use, and opportunities to engage AYA in evidence-based prevention and treatment of both conditions.

- Describe when pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) can be prescribed for AYA for HIV prevention.

- Identify strategies your practice can use to engage AYA in PrEP, substance use care, and HIV treatment.
